**Wednesday–Sunday 11:00 AM–3:00 PM**

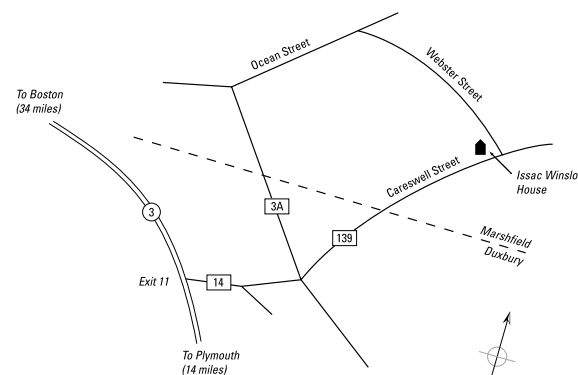
Free (Members); \$3/adult, \$1/child (Non-Members)
